



Assignment:

Students must keep a log on their novel. All entries in the log must be handwritten and 5-7 sentences in length. The log must include the following entries:

- L. Description of each of the main characters. (20 points)
- 2. Conflict- problems or challenges that arise for the characters. (20 points)
- 3. Resolution- how the story ends. (20 points)
- 4. Theme-message or lesson learned in the novel. (20 points)
- 5. Discuss why you liked or disliked the novel. (20 points)

There will be a comprehension test on this novel during the first week of school.
